

# Reentry Court

**What is this program**



Reentry Court is a program for defendants on supervised release whose substance use is contributing to interfering with rehabilitation

**Who is it for**



Medium to High risk and Medium to High needs defendants with substance use issues

**Goal of Program**



A reduced likelihood of program participants committing a new crime and the reduction of risk of recidivism

**How Long is the Program**



12m-18m

**What are the Qualifiers**



Out of custody defendant on supervised release or probation with Personal Risk and Criminogenic Need factors such as:

- Substance use or delinquency,
- Prior attempts at treatment or rehabilitation.

**What are the Disqualifiers**



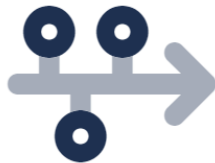
- Defendants in removal proceedings or with an active immigration detainer
- Pending Form 12

**What are the Successful Outcomes**



Reduction of term of supervised release or probation by one year.

**Steps and Timeline to Program Entry**



① Probation determines whether a candidate would be a good fit for program ② Depending on location – immediate placement or interview by Reentry Team.

**What Happens  
in the Program**



Participants meet at least 2 times a month in regular meetings with the Reentry team and other participants in their venue. The team includes judges, probation officers, AUSA, AFPD, a court graduate level social work intern or social worker and/or treatment professionals.

---

**What Happens if  
Participant is  
Successful**



A motion for reduction of supervised release or probation is made by the Reentry team at a court hearing at a Reentry graduation with party to follow.

---

**What Happens if  
Participant is  
Unsuccessful**



The participant continues on their preexisting term of supervised release or probation.
